Exam Exemptions

As an incentive for students to attend school regularly, students with excellent attendance may opt out of final exams. Students who do so, do not have to come to school for the portion of the day those final exams are given. Students who exempt all exams, will earn additional holidays at the end of each semester. The exam exemption rules are as follows:

- Students with an 85 average and no days absent may exempt.
- Students with a 90 average and no more than one absence in a class may exempt.
- Students with a 95 average and no more than two absences in a class may exempt.
- Students must not miss more than 10 minutes out of a class period to be counted present for that class period.
- Any student with an unexcused absence will lose the exam exemption.
- Any student who has four or more tardies to a class will lose the exam exemption.
- Any student who has a written dress code violation, In-School Suspension, Out-of-School Suspension, bus suspension, or other discipline problems will lose exemption.
- School sanctioned field trips; functions and/or competitions do not count against the absence totals for exemption status.

Requirements for Driver's Permit

Students taking a test for the driver's permit will need to obtain a school compliance verification form from the school office prior to the end of the school year. The form is good for 60 days. Please contact Debbie Lewis at (270)527-8377, ext. 120 or dlewis@christianfellowship.org.

CFS Policy for Making up Inclement Weather Days
